

Our Mission

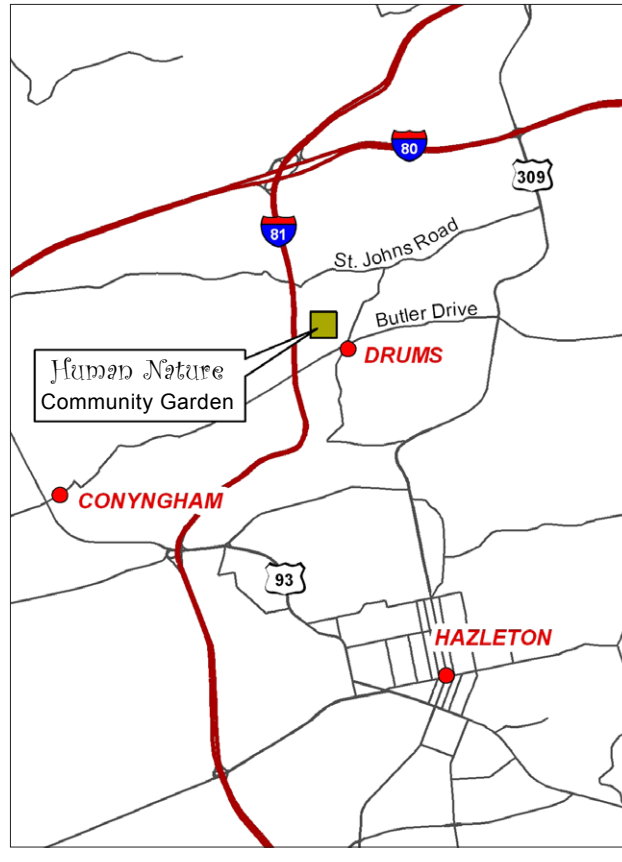

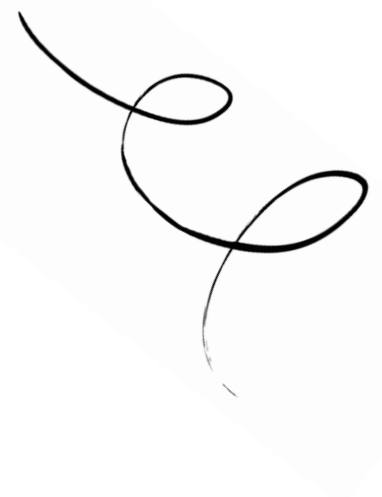


Location

The Human Nature Community Garden is located in Freedom Park, 415 W. Butler Drive in Drums, Pennsylvania (approximately 2 miles west of Route 309). The garden is operated and managed in partnership with Butler Township.

About the Camp

The CLDS Garden Discovery Camp is a four week summer day camp for kids entering grades 4 to 7, which is designed to encourage hands-on study, science exploration, socialization, and outdoor recreation within a safe and beautiful garden setting.



Activities will take place within the Butler Township Human Nature Community Garden in Drums, where the kids will maintain their own garden, learn about bees, birds, butterflies, and worms, take a few nature hikes to the nearby woodlands, and get a chance to eat fresh veggies grown in the garden.

The summer camp curriculum will integrate educational materials and programs provided by the Penn State Cooperative Extension 4H Program, as well as other environmental curricula developed by the National Gardening Association.

About the Instructors

The lead instructor for the camp will be Mary-Lee Hood, a certified Master Gardener with the Luzerne County Cooperative Extension. Each week Mary-Lee will be joined by guest instructors (other Master Gardeners, naturalists, and experts in their field) to help the kids explore the topics of the day.

Camp Sessions

Session One: June 14 – July 9

Session Two: July 19 – Aug 13

Each session will run Monday, Wednesday, and Friday mornings from 9AM to 1PM.

Cost

Cost per child is \$125/session (a discounted fee of \$100/session applies to CLDS Members and Butler Township Residents).

Camp registration will be on a first-come, first-serve basis. Applications will be accepted until a session is filled (maximum enrollment of 15), at which point a waiting list will be started. Full payment is due by May 15th to guarantee your slot.

A Typical Day

A typical day at the garden will involve a fast-paced schedule of activities designed to keep kids interested, active, and engaged with nature. On any given day, activities may include:

- Planting seeds
- Taking a nature hike
- Building a pole bean tipi
- Transplanting seedlings
- Doing yoga
- Learning about butterflies
- Digging for worms
- Watching a cooking demonstration
- Maintaining a journal
- Staking plants
- Arts & crafts
- Making a scarecrow
- Searching for good and bad garden bugs
- Taste-testing veggies grown in the garden
- Weeding and watering garden beds
- Playing games
- Having fun while learning.....

What to Bring

Kids should dress for the weather, wear closed-toe shoes or sneakers, and expect to be outside during the entire time. Campers should also expect to get dirty, and a change of clothes is recommended. Every camper should pack a water bottle, sunscreen, hat, and healthy bag lunch (special arrangements may be made for free lunches).
